Every year, Lifestyle Canada sends a team of students to Newfoundland and Labrador, with their Canada Youth Challenge (CYC) program, to sell and distribute literature.

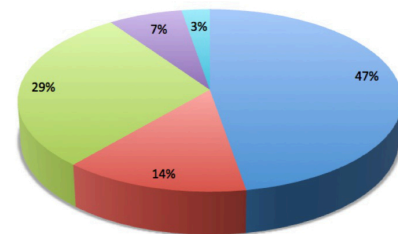

The typical protocol for the CYC students who come to Newfoundland and Labrador is for them to arrive in the province sometime in June. From there the students set up a base camp at the St. John's Seventh-day Adventist Church, where the students stay in the church fellowship hall and Sabbath School classrooms. To accommodate all their living and hygiene needs, they utilize the local church facilities and partner with the local YMCA, which allows for them to utilize their shower and gym facilities.

From June-August, each year, the CYC students go door-to-door selling and handing out literature, praying with people, and in some cases, even offering short Bible study sessions. While most of their time is spent in the Avalon Region, the CYC team saves a portion of their time to visit various other NL communities such as Gander, Grand Falls-Windsor, or Corner Brook, and perhaps others along the way.

This year, we get to see a glimpse of the impact Lifestyle Canada and the CYC program had on our province. The chart on the previous page shows that the CYC students visited 29,000 homes in NL and distributed 33,500 pieces of literature. Additional figures, not shown on the chart above include 1,300 prayers offered with and for individuals in the local communities and approximately 100+ interest cards gathered with indications of interest for services such as Depression Recovery Seminars, Healthy Cooking Schools and Correspondence Bible Study Courses.

We are thankful for the ministry of Lifestyle Canada and their programs, such as CYC. May the Lord continue to bless them and their ministry in the future.
