Creative Friendship Suppers Connect Botwood Church With Local Community

During the last Wednesday of the cold months, for the last four years, the Botwood Seventh-day Adventist Church has held a free community supper. Attendance varies, but usually there are between 30 to 50 people, with the highest attendance being between 70 and 75.

It's not just a supper however, often it's supper plus activity. For example, twice a year, the Church holds "Supper and a Movie". On March 28, 2018 they showed "Facing the Giants" film. The accompanying meal, prepared by Lois Gill, Verna Hemeon, and Delcie Hulsmann, was Mexican vegetarian with Quesadillas. Attendance was around 25 (slightly lower than usual, but likely due to it being held during "Holy Week").

Usually in May of the year, Botwood Church combines the supper with a benefit concert. Various musicians from the local Adventist and non-Adventist denominations all come together and sing. Funds that are raised during the event go to help VOAR Christian Family Radio.

Every September, the Church combines the friendship supper with a cooking class. Ana-Maria shares tips and insights from her experience and training as a Dietician and other church members participate as well.

The Church takes these opportunities to share literature and other resources with those in attendance. Furthermore, at the beginning of nearly all the suppers, while the volunteers are preparing the tables, Pastor Jonathan and Ana-Maria Gascoyne lead out in a sing-a-long. Ana-Maria plays piano, Pastor Jonathan leads in singing. Song sheets are passed out, giving everyone an opportunity to request favourites.

Overall, the Botwood Church has been able to utilize the "Friendship Suppers" as a fun and flexible way to connect with their local community. Many relationships have and are being developed through this creative outreach.

and great-grandmother of Samuel and Jonathan Penney, passed peacefully away at the Carbonear General Hospital on Wednesday, March 28, 2018.


The funeral was held, March 30, at the Riverside United Church, in Salmon Cove. Internment was held in Riverside United Cemetery, Salmon Cove.
