Duration: 1 Hour (45-minute presentation and 15-minute Q&A session).

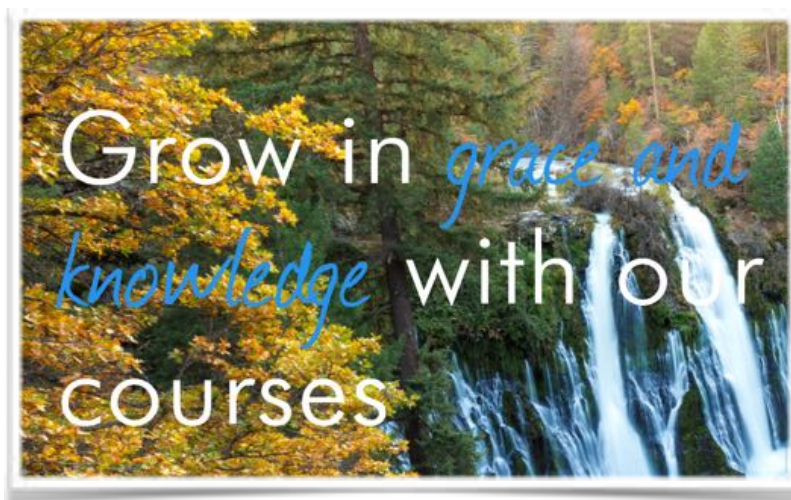
