YOUTH SPOTLIGHT

Tyler Legge is a 24-year-old, born and raised in Burin, Newfoundland and Labrador. Tyler began to attend church when he was seven years old. His father, Gordon Legge, was the one who introduced him and his brother to the Marystown Seventh-day Adventist Church. Tyler's favorite thing in church, growing up, was the Children's Story. He would love it when his dad would tell the story, and he could go up front and listen to what exciting things he had to say. As Tyler grew older, he began to have a particular passion for music; when he was 16 years old, he took an interest in singing. The first song that Tyler ever sang in church was his favorite song, "How Great Thou Art," and his father accompanied him on guitar. Tyler and Gordon Legge have been singing and playing together since. Tyler has a few roles in the

church such as leading out in song service and doing the audio for everyone each Sabbath. Tyler has had a fascinating relationship with Jesus and the Church and gives much credit to sticking with it to his Heavenly and earthly Father. Gordon has always kept him on the straight and narrow, holding him accountable for his actions, and showing Tyler the importance of faithfulness and helping Tyler pursue his love for music and supporting all his desires to follow Jesus. Six years ago; Gordon had been diagnosed with Cancer and was only given a maximum of two years to live after his diagnosis.
