



The Corner Brook Church recently launched a Faith-Raising Project called Trust Him 3.0, with Psalm 37:5 as the theme text: "Trust him, and He will help you." (NLT)

The Corner Brook Church recently launched a Faith-Raising Project called Trust Him 3.0, with Psalm 37:5 as the theme text: "Trust him, and He will help you." (NLT)

The object of the project is to grow to a new level of faith in God and His desire to take care of us by committing to return tithe (10% of the money we receive), and by committing to give offerings (3% of the money we receive) to Church Budget or Church Expense until March 15, 2020. At that time, the success of the project would be evaluated.

Some of the benefits of this Faith-Raising Project were shared with the Church family:

Greater awareness of personal spending and priorities (Matthew 6:24)

A richer experience with the living God who provides for us (2 Corinthians 9:8; Genesis 22:14)

A more satisfying and secure life with less anxiety (Matthew 6.31-32)

Honour for God (Proverbs 3:9)

A safeguard against greed (Colossians 3:5; 2 Corinthians 9:11)

Deeper trust in the Holy Spirit's ability to help us in all areas of our lives (John 14:26-27)

A closer friendship with Jesus (John 15:9,10,15)

Those who are currently giving at the 10/3 percent levels were encouraged to move to a new level of faith in God (perhaps Trust Him 4.0 or 5.0).

It was suggested that, before signing the commitment cards, some may want to talk it over with their spouse or family. The commitments were not handed in since they are between the individuals and God, to be kept in Bibles or a place at home as a reminder of their decision.

Trust Him 3.0 messages of encouragement and Bible promises are being included in the weekly Church Bulletin.

The Church family is looking forward to voluntary testimonies of richer experiences with God, confirming His faithfulness, which would be an indicator of the success of the project.

The bottom of the "My Commitment" card has a phrase that summarizes what it's all about:

"God doesn't need my money - He wants my trust."
