
LIGHTHOUSE FM RADIO PRESENTS

CHURCH REOPENING SCHEDULE AND GUIDELINES

It has been an incredible opportunity to worship together every Sabbath for the past five months. Some positive things that have come out of the ZOOM LiNC worship include; rural members have been able to attend each Sabbath, those who have moved away have been able to log in and have a taste of home, and it's even provided some new people to try our church uniquely. Overall, it has been a tremendously positive experience. But, now the time has come where we can reopen our church buildings. So, what does that mean for our online worships?

As a team, the NL Mission has voted to continue our online ZOOM worship experiences. Every week a different church on the island will host a Sabbath service, live-streaming from their district. It will still give the diversity of worship styles, the option to stay home if you are feeling unwell, or unsafe, and it will also provide the opportunity to meet more people outside of our church family.

Bonavista Seventh-day Adventist Church: Opening this Sabbath August 29, 2020.

Conception Bay South Seventh-day Adventist Church: Currently opened each Sabbath.

Marystown Seventh-day Adventist Church: Opening September 5, 2020.

Lethbridge Seventh-day Adventist Church: Opening September 5, 2020 at 3:00 p.m.

St. John's Seventh-day Adventist Church: Opening September 12, 2020.

The other districts will be announcing when they are ready to reopen in the next few weeks. Please note that each church will be following the guidelines set by the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador and Adventist Risk Management. Masks are now required to be worn inside all buildings, including places of worship.

Mazidra

Mazidra, a lentil and rice dish, makes a complete meal and you can be sure you will be satisfied as well as full.

Preparation Time: 30-40 minutes.

Yield: 4 good servings

Ingredients:

- 8 ounces dried green or brown lentils
- 4 cups water
- 1 McCormick's Beef, Chicken or Vegetable

flavoured bouillon

- 1 or 2 Garlic cloves, minced
- 1 Bay leaf
- · Salt to taste
- · 3 large onions, sliced thinly
- 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 1 teaspoon white sugar, optional
- 1/4 1/2 teaspoon salt for onions
- 3 or 4 cups hot cooked whole grain rice
- 2 tablespoons olive oil, to garnish



Suggested Toppings

Shredded lettuce
Diced tomatoes
Sliced green onions
Diced green and/or red peppers
Sliced black olives
Diced cucumber
Shredded carrots
Diced avocado or guacamole
Salsa, optional

How to make it:

In large saucepan, combine dried lentils, water, garlic and bay leaf. Bring to a boil and turn temperature down; cover and simmer for approximately 10 minutes. Add the bouillon cube and salt to taste and continue simmering another 20 minutes or until lentils are tender. If the lentils look dry add a little hot water. Keep warm.

In large skillet, sauté onions rings in canola oil until tender and lightly caramelized. You may sprinkle 1 teaspoon sugar over the onions while cooking to help with the caramelization. Salt the onions to taste. Mix onions with lentils or reserve the onions to pile on top of finished recipe. (That's what I do.)

To serve, place a serving of hot rice on plate, top with a serving of hot lentils (and onions if reserving). Drizzle with a little olive oil. Add lettuce and vegetables. Add salsa and sour cream if desired.
