This past fall, the NL Mission, in partnership with LCES, undertook a Facebook Ad Campaign to encourage the people of NL to avail of helpful material. The major gift book offered was entitled "The Power of Hope." When people requested a book online, there were other spiritual support options, such as requesting prayer or Bible Studies. Here are the results of this effort:

- 1. Over 113,900 Facebook ads posted
- 2. Over 17,900 people made contact with the ads

- 4. The book helps people deal with depression, anxiety, guilt and addictions

So, to say we reached our total goal by the end of that same day clearly shows this was a God thing! It seemed the devil was working overtime trying to make everything go wrong, but God said, "I've got you...watch this!" By the next afternoon, an extra \$5000 had also come in.




NL BAPTISMS
